- 19 July. <u>ABC.net</u>.au: <u>'I'd rather be dead': Euthanasia inquiry to examine Melbourne woman's plea to die</u>. 78 year old Melbourne writer Edel Wignell would rather die than endure any more of the debilitating pain that has dominated her life for 30 years. This story quotes Rodney Syme.
- 23 July. Canberra Times: Conversation continues on end of life options for the ACT. University of Canberra associate professor in the school of law and justice, Dr Wendy Bonython, believes the ACT will have to wait for the states to make laws on voluntary euthanasia or assisted suicide before it becomes an option to pursue locally. She was addressing the second end-of-life forum hosted by Labor Member for Ginninderra Mary Porter.
