- 14 Sept. <u>abc.net.au</u>: The Drum: <u>Doctor-assisted dying shouldn't be a taboo subject</u>. Now is the time to have an open and real discussion about doctor-assisted dying, writes Miranda Simpson.

- 15 Sept. SBS TV: <u>Allow me to die</u>. The Dateline TV program on the Belgium situation where a non-terminally ill 85-year-old opted for euthanasia and raising the question of whether Belgium's legislation is unnecessarily encouraging euthanasia.
